

Damage by 1985 Mantua Village Fire Repaired

The burned out wall from the 1985 fire of the old Weber Hardware building in Mantua Village has been an unfortunate eyesore for many years.

B&H Rentals recently received funding from Neighborhood Development services, enabling crews from Benner Masonry & Hummel Construction to begin securing the site.

The divider has been rebuilt as an insulated 14" cavity wall creating a firewall between it and the old building. The new energy code has been met along with other structural standards which will allow for future expansion. The structural upgrade will preserve the existing building for development of mixed use with commercial on the 1st floor and apartments on the 2nd. The new code upgrade, designed by local civil engineer Hal Stamm, will enable a new facility to be built



on the vacant site.
